		On the occasion of World Patient Safety Day 2024, the Department of Otorhinolaryngology organized a sensitization program aimed at raising awareness about patient safety among non-teaching staff. The event revolved around this year's theme, "Get it right to make it right," emphasizing the critical role each		

healthcare worker plays in maintaining patient safety standards.

Proceedings:

The program commenced with a welcome address by Prof. Dr. Santhosh Kumar Rajamani, Professor of Otorhinolaryngology, who set the tone for the day by highlighting the significance of patient safety in the healthcare setting. Dr. Rajamani underscored that patient safety is a collective responsibility and stressed the importance of adhering to safety protocols to prevent errors and ensure quality care.

Following the welcome address, the program proceeded with two expert talks:

 - ✓ The use of safety protocols like the WHO Surgical Safety Checklist to minimize surgical errors.
 - Proper sterilization, infection control, and handling of surgical instruments.
 - ✓ Strategies to prevent and manage postoperative complications.
- 2. Dr. Anusha Venkatraman discussed Patient Safety in Casualty and Ward, focusing on:
 - ✓ The role of efficient triage and patient handover in delivering prompt and appropriate care.
 - Medication safety, including accurate prescription practices and correct drug administration.
 - ✓ Maintenance of hygiene standards to prevent falls and reduce hospital-acquired infections.

✓ Clear and effective communication with patients and their families regarding healthcare procedures and plans. Interactive Session: An interactive session followed the presentations, providing attendees an opportunity to engage with the speakers. Questions and real-life scenarios were discussed, further reinforcing the day's theme, "Get it right, make it safe!" The discussions emphasized that meticulous care in daily practices is crucial to ensuring patient safety. Outcome: The program successfully educated non-teaching staff on the critical aspects of patient safety in various healthcare settings. The staff left the program with enhanced knowledge and practical strategies to apply in their roles, ultimately contributing to a safer healthcare environment. Feedback: Feedback from the participants was overwhelmingly positive. Many expressed their appreciation for the insights gained and committed to implementing the discussed safety protocols in their daily tasks. The program helped cultivate a proactive approach toward identifying and addressing patient safety risks.
