Brief summary of the event in around 100 words (purpose, conduct, feedback, impact, suggestions)	<p>World Eye Donation Day was observed by the Department of Ophthalmology, MIMER Medical College and Dr. BSTR Hospital on 10th June 2026 with the objective of creating awareness regarding eye donation and encouraging voluntary eye donation pledges among the public.</p> <p>The celebration included a variety of awareness and service-oriented activities conducted within the hospital premises. A Free Eye Check-up Camp was organized for patients and members of the public, providing comprehensive ophthalmic examinations and counselling regarding eye health. In addition, free in-house ophthalmic investigations were offered to eligible beneficiaries to facilitate early detection and management of ocular conditions. The total beneficiaries were 70.</p> <p>An Eye Donation Pledge Drive was conducted throughout the day to motivate individuals to pledge their eyes for donation after death. Participants were</p>

		<p>educated about the process of eye donation, eligibility criteria, and the role of corneal transplantation in restoring vision to corneally blind individuals. A total of around 200 pledge forms were received.</p> <p>To further enhance awareness, an audio-visual display on eye donation and eye health was showcased in the Ophthalmology OPD. The display highlighted the importance of eye donation, myths and facts associated with the procedure, and the impact of donor corneas in giving the gift of sight.</p> <p>Eye donation awareness talks were organized for patients in the OPD as well as undergraduate medical students. The sessions emphasized the need for eye donation, the shortage of donor corneas, the process of corneal retrieval and transplantation, and the social responsibility of promoting eye donation within the community.</p> <p>The World Eye Donation Day celebration was a great success, benefiting a large number of patients, attendants, students, and hospital staff. The activities significantly enhanced awareness regarding eye donation and encouraged active participation in the pledge drive, reinforcing the message that eye donation is a noble act that can transform lives by restoring sight.</p> <p>.</p>
