“Best Library Readers Award -2024’ to Dr. Leena Shiboo Professor Department of Anaesthesia

“BEST LIBRARY USER AWARD”

To motivate the students and Faculty Member to make the efficient use of the library and its services, the ‘**Best Library User Award**’ for student and faculty members has been strated.Two students are selected one from the UG and One from PG and one from faculty members, on the basis of the statistical data of library usage accession of books, Utilization of library resources. Every year this award conferred on the occasion of Annual Gathering Day.

BEST LIBRARY USER AWARD SELECTION CRITERIA (Total Points- 50)

The selection criteria for the Best Library User Award are very thorough and focus on a well-rounded evaluation of a user's interaction with the library. Here’s a breakdown of the award criteria again, with some potential suggestions for implementation and tracking:

1. Library Visiting (15 Points):

- Track the number of visits through a library check-in system, where users register their entry and exit times.
- Alternatively, monitor the number of hours spent using library facilities or attending events (study groups, workshops, etc.).

2. Books Usage (15 Points):

- Record the number of books borrowed by each user. This could be tracked by library staff or via an online catalogue where users log their borrowed items.
- Include both textbooks and general reading books, encouraging users to engage with a variety of resources.

3. Journals Usage (10 Points):

- Keep a record of how many print journals users refer to, or use a system where they can check out or register the journals they've accessed.
- Consider encouraging the review of academic journals in addition to general reading to align with scholarly usage.

4. Timely Return of Books (5 Points):

- Track the return dates of borrowed books to ensure they are returned on time. If users frequently return books late, they could lose points, while punctual returners gain maximum points.

5. Usage of Online Resources (5 Points):

- Monitor users' engagement with online resources (e-journals, e-books, databases). This could be tracked through the number of downloads, logins, or time spent using these digital materials.

In India, the history of medical libraries can be traced back to the period of 2nd century BC. The Nalanda and Taxila Universities housed the Charaka Samhita, Sushruta Samhita and the commentaries on these by their successors. Numbers of medical institutions have started during pre and post-independence period. Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), New Delhi.

Came into existence during 1911 which is one among the oldest research institutions in the world. National Medical Library has been started in New Delhi during 1946. Under HO SEARO, HELLIS network project was started during 1982, then 7th ICMR-NIC centre has come into operational during 1988. Number of medical institutions increased rapidly during last two decades.

The global library services from National Library of Medicine (USA), World Health Organization (WHO), Geneva are being made available in the country through networks, with the application of ICT's. Numbers of bio-medical resources comprising on-line, off-line databases, open access resources are also adding to the collection of medical libraries one after another. Best-practices have also come into existence.

As a result of information proliferation, the concept of networking has gained the momentum at all levels; led to establishment of consortia for resource sharing among the medical libraries in India. Those libraries working in the medical institutions are regulated by Medical Council of India (MCI), New Delhi through its standards and guidelines.

1.2 The issued books will be renewed ONLY once for all library users.

1.3 Members to be personally present for borrowing books from the Library.

1.4 Books that will not be issued. Reference books, rare, Dictionaries, Encyclopaedia & Atlases, Loose Leaf Volumes, If only Single copy is available in library.

1.5 No Sub lending of the books borrowed from the Library is permitted.

1.6 Books and other materials that have been issued out of the library are liable to be recalled at any time and when so recalled they must be returned at once.



1.7 Before leaving the counter the borrower of the book should satisfy himself/ herself as to whether the book is issued to him/her is in good condition. If a book found defective in any respect, He/ She should immediately bring the matter to the notice of the Librarian. If the book is found in damaged condition at the time of returning, the borrower will have to replace the book.

1.8 Tracing or mechanical reproduction, underlining or taking out pages from the books, disfiguring of the books is strictly prohibited. In such cases the member will have to replace the book or will have to pay the price of the latest edition of the said book.

2. Delay in Returning Books:

- The entire book issued for home use to students and teaching staff must be returned to the Library within the specified period.
- For students a fine of Rs.10 per day will be charged for the period of delay. Monthly details of the same will be sent to the Students Section.
- If books issued to the teaching staff members are not received within the specified period, the reminder for returning or renewal of the books would be sent to them. If in spite of sending 2 reminders, for the return of books, the teaching staff does not respond, then a fine of Rs.10 per day will be charged.

3. Loss of Books:

- If someone has lost a book borrowed from the library, the concerned will have to pay the cost of the latest edition of the book within one month.

4. Journals:

- No journals will be issued for home reading.
- Journals will be available for reading in Central Library Journal Section only for teaching faculty and PG students. Xerox facility is available if required with prior permission from librarian.

Departmental Libraries:

The Departmental Libraries are an extension of the Central Library. All activities of the Departmental Library shall be monitored by the Head of the Department.

- The Head of the Department shall appoint a faculty above the Assistant Professor Cadre as Library In charge. The name of the Library In charge shall be communicated to the Librarian. Under the leadership of the Head of the Department, the Library In charge shall carry out the various activities related to the upkeep and smooth functioning of the Departmental Library and shall communicate with the Librarian/ Library Committee members as and when required.



- The Head of the Department shall be solely responsible for books issued to the Departmental Library from the Central Library. An updated record of books issued from the Central Library to the Departmental Library should be maintained in the Department.
- The Library In charge shall maintain a proper register of issue of books from Departmental library to the staff members.
- If there is only a single copy of a book, such books will be kept in the Central Library only and will not be issued to the Departmental Library.
- When sending requirements of books to be purchased, the Head of Department should try to avoid duplication of book and should recommend books which are absolutely necessary.
- Interdepartmental transfer of books is not permitted. Written permission should be taken from the Librarian in this regard.
- Librarian/ Any member of Library appointed by the Librarian will carry out. Annual verification of Departmental Library with prior intimation. The Library In charge will help in this verification process.



Total Usage by Year









JR'S RESEARCH CLUB
