Vakratunda is our college's Ganesh festival. Every year it is celebrated in our college auditorium for five days, with *aagman* of Ganesha on the 1st day and *visarjan* on the 5th.

This time, it was not possible to physically go to the college and organize and celebrate. So we thought, why not bring the festival at home then emerged the idea of **Digital Vakratunda 2020**. MISSION ZINDAGI

Mission Zindagi initiated **Blood on Demand**.

AIM:

- To fulfil the never ending demand of blood in our hospital

OBJECTIVES:

- To increase the number of volunteering donors by abolishing all stigmas and misconceptions about blood donation through education drives.
- To create a network of members by connecting them on individual blood segregated WhatsApp groups.
- To provide blood on demand emergencies on a daily basis through our membership network.
- To highlight the problems incurred in mass donation programs by awareness programs within the college and other local areas of Talegaon.
- To avoid mass donation programs and the substantial loss of blood caused by them due to wastage in our blood bank.

WHAT EXACTLY WILL HAPPEN?

- In case of emergencies the blood bank would contact Mission: Zindagi Representatives and whatsapp message would alert the members.
- Volunteering members would be asked to report to the blood bank.
- With a smooth channel, the blood bank would notify mission zindagi with the names of the volunteers.
- This will be saved in our database and the donor will be notified after 3 months when he is again fit to donate blood.
- This would be possible only with the continuous efforts of the representatives who will visit the blood bank regularly to collect updates.

HIGHLIGHTS:

A team of 11 volunteers from Facebook all the way from the United States of America visited the Mission Zindagi Headquarters at MIMER Medical College to understand the newly conceptualised plan to provide blood on demand. After healthy discussions and suggestions, they were amazed at the functioning of a rural hospital's blood bank relief measures.

Mission Zindagi was featured in the newspaper which highlighted the need to shift to a blood on demand system rather than a blood donation drive.

Mission Zindagi have collaborated with MSAI in 2018 and 2019 blood donation day to spread awareness about the same.

Mission Jindagi hopes to transform our organisation into an App created for our college management, faculty, workers and students. It's an attempt to centralise the system and channelise technology to provide for our organisation.

- 4) This will help to keep sufficient stock of blood in the Blood Bank for routine requirement as well as for emergencies.





STUDENT RESEARCH COUNCIL

Student Research Council was formed on 29th October, 2018.

The Student Research Council MIMER (MIMERSRC) is a group of research-oriented students, with the aim to make Undergraduate research more feasible and accessible. Through workshops, seminars and webinars, the MIMERSRC teaches students research methodology, scientific presentations, biostatistics and other vital topics that stand in the way of medical students interested in research. Under the able guidance of Dr. Derek D'Souza (faculty advisor) and Dr. Oshin Behl (student advisor), the MIMER SRC has grown from a 4 member core committee with 33 members in its first year (2018-2019) to having a 13 member core committee (with Conference and Publishing sub-committees) with 98 members.

Research methodology workshop was arranged by student research council:

4. Putting the results into a written format, and an overview of how to write the paper (a more detailed workshop can be conducted on paper writing later)

Task 4 : *to prepare a skeleton of the paper*, for eg. what points you'll cover in Introduction, what the aims are, and your methods (these 3 will be just an expanded version of the proposal), and then results and conclusion points if you can.

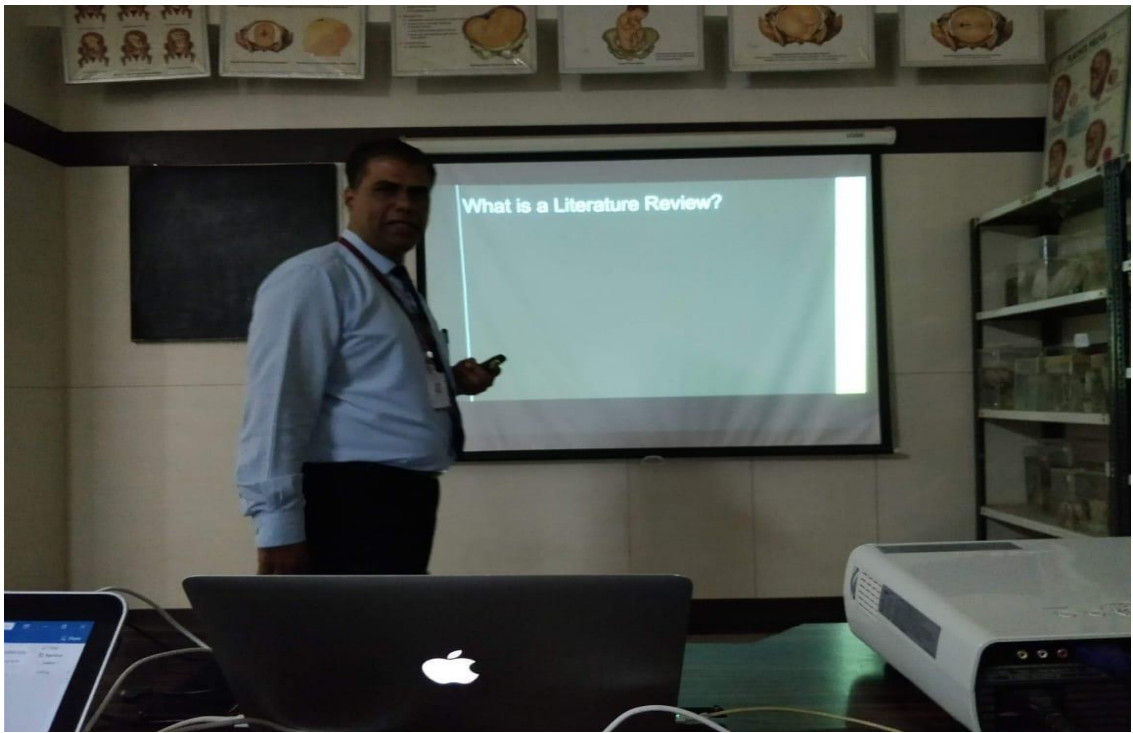
