


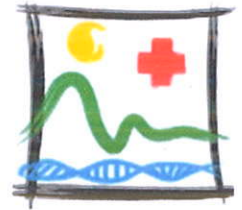

Dear Respected Sir/Madam,

This is to inform you that we had formulated a project proposal on "Patient Antibiotic Use Documentation: The overlooked facet in resource limited healthcare", mentored by Dr. Sandhya Kulkarni with guidance from the Microbiology Department. The project primarily examined the role of patient involvement in curbing the pressing issue of antibiotic resistance in the local set up. We had submitted the proposal for an international student competition, **Innovate4AMR** where it was reviewed by a panel of expert judges in the field of public health and anti microbial resistance.

We are pleased to report that out of 145 proposals submitted, we had successfully been selected as one of the 11 winning teams of the competition and were therefore invited to attend the capacity building conference on antimicrobial resistance hosted by ReAct – Action on Antibiotic Resistance, International Federation of Medical Students Associations (IFMSA), the IDEA Initiative at the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, the World Health Organization and South Centre in Geneva, Switzerland from 15th-17th November, 2018.

Innovate4AMR's workshop invited winning student teams from all around the world (Peru, Uganda, Philippines, China, United States, Honduras, India, Canada, Pakistan and Nigeria) to present their innovative solutions for anti-microbial stewardship in resource limited healthcare with the hopes of engaging the next generation of leaders in developing innovative, scalable approaches to address the challenge of conserving existing antibiotics.

The 3 day workshop provided us with in-depth sessions on numerous topics related to the implementation of our initiative such as understanding and addressing the challenges in AMR Stewardship including the aspect of behaviour change and managing the supply chain of antibiotics, examining the various aspects of project management such as policy tools and fundraising, and mobilising various stakeholders and constituencies through potential modes of intervention and advocacy.

We had the chance to interact and gain inputs from some wonderful current leaders in Public Health including Dr. Marc Sprenger, Director of the AMR Secretariat at the World Health Organization and Dr. Anthony D. So, Head of ReAct North America and Founding Director of IDEA initiative at Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health.

It has been an amazing experience and given us the opportunity to represent our college and country and learn so much to carry forward while designing and implementing health initiatives in the future.

We are grateful to Dr. Sandhya ma'am and the Microbiology department for advising and encouraging us through the proposal drafting.

Cardiology

Cancellations must be submitted via email to int.med@fiu.edu. Due to program demand, a penalty of US\$150.00 will be charged per rotation cancelled. Any cancellations received 59–31 days prior to the start of the program are subject to a fee of 20% of the program cost. No shows and cancellations received 30 days or less prior to the start of the program are subject to the full program cost and no refunds will be given. Please note: cancellation fees are based upon the date the written request is received by FIU.

Additionally, FIU shall have the right to cancel your participation in the program and you will not be eligible for a refund of any program costs, if all required program documents are not submitted at least two (2) weeks prior to your scheduled start date.

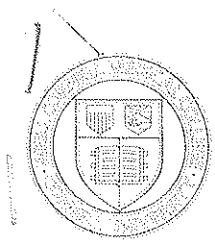


