 - b. Biomedical waste disposal as per Govt. Rules and adequate training for Non-Teaching staff for disposal of bio medical waste.
 - c. Celebration of World Environment Day.
2. As per State Government drive 110 **saplings** were planted
3. Maintenance of more than 200 saplings planted last year is being done regularly.
4. Sewage treatment plant (STP) with the capacity 300 M3 per day is functional and the recycled water is given to garden.
5. Solar energy generation –by implementing **500KWP** solar roof top power plant equivalent to “Planting 34500 mature trees with annual CO2 abatement of 385 tones.


